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#### YOUR PRINCIPAL WRITES:

It was wonderful to see so many smiling faces at school for Kinder Transition this week. The students have been involved in exciting activities including lessons on the Smartboard. Mrs Denise Barnes, Kinder teacher for 2011, is conducting the program. Thank you to the Year 5 students for helping out as buddies and we look forward to next week.

Congratulations to students and teachers for a successful Charity Day last Friday. The school raised \$1479 for worthwhile causes. Thank you to parents, carers and community for coming along and supporting us.

The intensive swimming scheme starts Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November to Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> December. It is primarily for students from Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety. We have been allocated swimming instructor funding for 19 students at Kootingal pool. Parents need to cover the cost of pool entry and bus travel. A note has been sent out with the details to parents who nominated for their child to attend. If there are available spaces then they will be offered to new students to our school in Year 1-Year 3 and students in higher grades.

Thank you to parents/carers who have returned the spelling and technology surveys and a reminder to others to please send them in. It was great to see the surveys conducted on line and parents/carers are still able to access the survey on the school's website. The information is important and will help to set directions and goals for 2011.

The P&C held its last meeting for the year on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November. I would like to thank the parents for coming along and supporting the school throughout the year. The P&C is a valued and important part of our school community. We

are very grateful for their commitment and dedication in helping our students to have the best education possible. It is through the hard work and fundraising that we have been able to continually upgrade resources at the school.
