YOUR PRINCIPAL WRITES:

Nemingha Public School is staying ahead in Science and one area is the 'Scientist In Schools' program, an initiative by the Department of Education & Communities and CSIRO. Last Friday I attended a workshop at the Australian Museum in Sydney with Dr Robin Gunning our Scientist partner. We had an eventful day sharing ideas, meeting other participants and discovering how other CSIRO Education programs can support both 'Scientist In Schools' and the Australian Curriculum. Dr Gunning followed this up with a visit to the school on Tuesday 13th September she worked with Years 3 and 4 on insects and conducted a 'bug walk' around the school. We have activities planned for the other classes next term.

Whilst in Sydney, I had the opportunity to attend the official opening of the 'Operation Art' competition at the Armory Gallery, Olympic Park on Saturday 10th September. It was a spectacular event and a huge crowd of people. The Hon. Mr Barry O'Farrell Premier NSW gave a presentation and there was a wonderful display of dancing, music and singing by students from primary and secondary schools. Art works from many schools across the state were on display in the gallery and it was an honour to see three Nemingha Public School artworks amongst 759 entries. Congratulations to Caitlin Ross, Thomas Haling and Isabella Cameron. Thomas's and Isabella's work were selected for 'Operation ArtBank' and their works will be given to regional hospitals and regional offices in NSW. Thomas's art work will be photographed for the Teachers Art Resource CD. This CD has 200 examples of art work to illustrate a wide variety of teaching strategies for schools.

Thank you to the teachers for the quality teaching in Art and especially Mrs Vanessa Fox for co-ordinating the competition. It is a significant promotion for our school with 7 000 people visiting the display.

Year 3 and 4 students, Mr Bellis and Mrs Price came back from their excursion to Lake Keepit on Friday 2nd September very excited and tired. Students are to be commended for their positive behaviour and having a go at all the activities. Thank you to the teachers and parents for their hard work and support.

We are in the final stages of rehearsing for the 'Alice In Wonderland' concert and endeavouring to make this a great production to give the students the experience of performing in a quality and professional show. Thank you to Mr Ken MacLean for giving up his time to design and paint the stage scenery, it really looks like a 'Wonderland'. Thank you also to the parents who are continually helping with costumes, props and items.

Video and Photographs – We have a volunteer to take a school video on Wednesday night and we would like someone to video on Thursday night. If you have good experience with videoing, and would like to help out, please contact the school. Videos will then be available for purchase after the concert. We also have a professional photographer coming to take photos at the full dress rehearsal. If you would like to purchase photos of your child, proofs will be on display in the school foyer in the weeks following the concert. Teachers will also be taking photos of students in their costumes and class groups and these photos will be for the students' portfolios. Unfortunately, videoing and taking photos during the performance will be prohibited due to copyright and child protection regulations.

It has been a high powered term. Thank you to staff and students for all the hard work in making this term a success. Thank you to parents/carers and the community for the continued support and partnership. I wish everyone a happy and safe holiday and look forward to another excellent term, especially our Concert.

K-1

In these last few weeks of Term 3, K-1 students have been completing some assessment tasks for maths, writing and reading. They have all tried their very best to concentrate and do their best effort; I have been very pleased with their persistence and concentration.

This week the Kinder students have been learning about -eg words and next week we will look at -ed words. We are continuing to focus on medial sounds (a, e, i, o, u) and blending sounds to spell CVC (consonant- vowel-consonant) words.

Year 1 students have been looking at the a sound which can be written as ai and ay. They have made a snail to remind them of the spelling of these different words. Next week Year 1 will be practicing some High Frequency words which can be a little tricky.

Last Wednesday the students enjoyed the Cricket Clinic. They loved the opportunity to do skills like the big kids and the sample bag was a very welcome surprise for everyone.

As the Alice in Wonderland concert draws nearer we, (Kinder and K-1) would like to have a pre-Dress rehearsal next week (Week 10) so children need to bring their track pants or leggings to school with a pair of socks that match the colour of their pants/leggings. TELEPHONE NUMBERS

We have been having some difficulty contacting families in cases of emergency. If you have changed your telephone number—especially mobile numbers, please let the school know immediately so that our records can be updated. As you can imagine it is quite distressing to the sick, injured or wet child having to sit in the Sick Bay until home time.

HEADLICE

Headlice are on the move again, please check your children's hair thoroughly, and treat them with products available from the chemist. Constant scratching of the head is a good indicator that your child might be suffering an infestation.

CHICKEN POX

We have a confirmed case of chicken pox in the school be aware of indicators; high temperatures, small raised rose pink spots may appear one after the other on the scalp, face, trunk, arms legs and inside the mouth. Spots are followed by small blisters which then form crusts.

LOST PROPERTY

Please check and collect lost property before the end of term. Any unnamed and unclaimed uniforms will be returned to Clothing Pool. Items that do not have school logos or are not part of the school uniform will be given to charity.


