Advice for parents on student holiday reading

There are many excellent children's books that students can enjoy over the school holidays.

The Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) <u>Book of</u> <u>the Year Awards 2015</u> (cbca.org.au/awards.htm) is a good starting point for recommendations, or try their <u>previous</u> <u>award winners</u>.

When parents are selecting a book, the most important advice is to choose one that will generate enthusiasm for and an interest in reading, leaving the student with a feeling of achievement and motivated to read another book.

When parents are selecting books:

- ✓ ensure the book is one that the student will enjoy, with not too many words that they don't understand,
- ✓ identify a suitable genre, theme or topic that is interesting to the reader,
- ✓ suggest books where there are other books by that author (especially a series) so that children look forward to the next one,
- ✓ speak to the child's teacher. They will be able to make some suggestions about what would be suitable for your child.
