Music lessons in 2019

We are beginning to make our arrangements for next year's music lessons. If you are interested in your child learning and instrument, could you please contact the school office.

These lessons are conducted during the school day and are delivered by private tutors, who will invoice you direct. The costs of lessons are extremely reasonable. Our tutors teach violin, piano, flute, clarinet, saxophone, guitar and drums.

The school has a limited number of instruments (clarinets, flutes, saxophone, trumpet, violins, cellos and double bass) available for loan. A security deposit of \$100 is required before instruments can be handed out. Provided there has been no damage to the instrument, this will be returned to you at the conclusion of lessons.

Contracts for tuition will be sent home if you are interested in your child joining this program.
