If you don't know the question, how will you recognise the answer?

Any parent will tell you that one of the most annoying habits young children have is their penchant for the "Why Game".

In this game, the child observes something and demands that the parent explain it. "Why is the sky blue?" is the classic example. But more bizarre questions often pop up, such as

"Why doesn't the week start with the weekend?" or, "How does my brain know what my name is?"

These questions are concerning not only because they can be time-consuming, but also

because they often show us the limits of what we ourselves know. We don't like being reduced to the answer "just because." Nonetheless, we encourage our children to ask such questions because we realise that they help to develop intelligence and curiosity.

How much time do you remember taking in school to ponder such questions? If you are like most people, your answer will be "not much."

Why? Often it's student-teacher ratios that make it impossible to consider everybody's questions, or perhaps

> the busy timetable of fitting in all Key Learning areas and extracurricular activities into a diminishing six-hour snapshot is also an impossible task. Yet it was questioning that caused Edison

to ponder which element would create light or Newton to rub his head from a gravity drawn apple and experiment further on what was keeping his feet firmly on the ground.

Questions spark further thought and inquiry and teachers develop strategies to get the best from their students.
