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### **Dealing with emergencies**

On Tuesday our school had to deal with a potential emergency with the local fire situation. Luckily it wasn't as dire as reported, however it allowed us the chance to respond to the situation and reflect on how effective we were.

While we hope that a natural disaster or other serious incident never occurs, our goal is to be prepared for any potential emergency. Each and every day, our first priority is to protect all students, staff and guests from harm.

The Department of Education has policies and procedures that we follow in case of imminent threat. Obviously in the recent event we took advice from the Rural Fire Service through the Tamworth DOE office. On Tuesday a nearby school was deemed non-operational due to a threat. Fortunately the fire spread in the opposite direction. We were made aware of the situation and monitored the RFS app.

On two occasions on Tuesday we became aware of reports of fires close to our school which, upon investigation, were false. It didn't help when local media and social media also relayed this false information. As soon as we became aware that there was no threat to the school we posted on Skoolbag and Class Dojo. I recommend everyone have both or either of these apps on their phones.

In future should the school need to cease operations we will notify parents via the two apps "SkoolBag" and "Class Dojo" to collect their children if possible. However we will immediately put into place our procedures for evacuation to Tamworth High School. This has been employed before, I believe, during floods.

In order for our Emergency and Evacuation plan to be effective, we depend on the cooperation and assistance of many people, such as the Police, Fire (RFS), and other local

agencies. We also depend on you, as parents, to support our response efforts. Your cooperation is vital in helping us protect the safety and welfare of all students and school employees.

Therefore, we ask parent to observe the following procedures:

- Make sure we have emergency contact information for each of your children at all times. We must be able to contact you or your designated representative in the event of an emergency.
- 2. Watch for notifications on the SkoolBag and Class Dojo apps.
- Collection of your children from school is possible in a short window. However, should we need to evacuate, children will be transported to Tamworth High School for collection.
- 4. Talk to your children and emphasise how important it is for them to follow instructions from their teachers during an emergency. Please emphasise the purpose and importance of appropriate behaviour during practice drills.
- Carefully read all information you receive from our school. You may receive updates about our school safety procedures from time to time.

We are proud that our school is a safe school, and we are doing everything possible to keep it that way. We appreciate your cooperation and support.

### **Books for library**

You may remember in a previous Newslink a story on Jane Simmonds, Executive Director School Services, who visited the school earlier in year with her team to talk to the staff and community members about the effects of the drought on our rural students.

They had an opportunity to see our desolate school grounds and talk to school staff, parents and School Council.

As a result, the Strathfield office staff have run a book drive

to donate the books for students of Nemingha, and the resources arrived last week.

With the recent bushfires which burnt down the New England school of Wytaliba the staff felt it most beneficial that we in turn donate these books to Wytaliba Public School.
