### Staying safe online

### On Monday this week we were very fortunate to have had a visit from Senior Constable King.

Senior Constable King spent the morning with our Year 5 and Year 6 students sharing information and strategies to help them stay safe online.

Below are some of the messages she shared:

- ✓ Create secure passwords; e.g. colour, animal, food, number.
- ✓ Share their account usernames and passwords with their parents/careers (parents pay for the internet, parents pay for the devices, parents are responsible for their child's actions online just as they are in the real world).
- Parents should be regularly checking their child's device to make sure the content they are looking up and the messages and content they are sharing is appropriate.
- ✓ Ask themselves, what am I telling the world about myself?
- ✓ Remember that anyone can create a fake profile and that the average age of an online gamer is 48 years old (the students were VERY surprised by this).
- ✓ Think before you send/post posting/sharing inappropriate material or asking someone else to post/ share inappropriate material is illegal
- ✓ Remember that it is illegal to take a picture of another person and post it online without permission – if you are asked to remove an image of someone you must do it.
- ✓ Be careful who they are friends with online. As a rule, friends that you know in real life should be the only online friends you have.
- ✓ Know that if you can't do it in the real world, you can't do it online – there can be serious consequences.

Senior Constable King concluded her presentation by reassuring the students that there is never anything so bad that they can't tell someone. People outside their family the students could talk to include, teachers, coaches, Kids Helpline (1800 55 1800) and Senior Constable King at Tamworth Police Station.
