Row the boat - /oa/, /oa/, /oa/

Week 9 nine will see us investigating the different ways the /oa/ sound is made. Some examples of the different ways we can make the /oa/ sound include; 'oa' in *boat*, 'o' in *comb* and 'ow' in *window*. This week we have included the extended sound box to show some of the less common ways to make the /oa/ sound.

TIPS FORKIDS

- ★ /oa/ is a long, moving sound.
- ★ This is a vowel sound, so nothing gets in the way of the air coming out.
