




# Party time in **2D**

The Dr Seuss book "Oh the Places You'll Go" is often referred to when discussing Year 12 students commencing their HSC examinations.

# SOUND OF THE WEEK

Mother and father on a ladder – /er/, /er/, / er/

During Week 6 we will investigate the /er/ sound and learn about the different ways it is represented. There are many ways the /er/ sound can be made. Have a look at the extended sound box online to see them all.

### TIPS FORKIDS

#### There is a chair

- ★ This is a lazy sound but it's quick to make.
- ★ This is a vowel sound, so nothing gets in the way of the air coming out.
- ★ This sound appears in a variety of places in words, eg: dinosaur, where the o is not produced as the /oa/ sound, but instead as a lazy schwa; butter where the /er/ is not produced as the /ir/ sound, but instead as a lazy schwa.
