## Working hard and getting ahead

#### This term 5/6M have been continuing to work hard and even start preparing for 2022.

Some of the skills they've been developing in maths include solving multiplication and division problems with large numbers, calculating areas in the playground involving decimal numbers and finding the volume of prisms using a formula.

I've been very proud of the determination shown by students during maths when they've been given challenging work and the progress they've made over the year. They now know that, when learning new skills, finding answers often requires multiple steps, overcoming obstacles and investing lots of time and effort.

During English lessons they've been learning about devices (not the technological type children today often associate with the word) - literary devices used by authors to improve their writing, such as hyperboles and personification. Again, they have become more adept throughout the term at identifying these in their reading group texts and experimenting with using them in their own written descriptions and arguments. It's been very rewarding to watch students strive to use something new in their work.

As the school year draws closer to the end, our class took some time this week to reflect on our successes, challenges, future goals and fun times together.
