The NSW Government has now stated that if people can work from home, they should do so.

In line with this principle, most of the Nemingha staff have been working remotely, although we are rostering staff to supervise on site. This allows staff to come and go according to their circumstances and needs. Despite this change, the school remains committed to supporting families by providing school-based supervision for students.

The strong guidance from the government is that students and staff should remain at home as much as possible, reduce physical proximity and contact with other people, and take all appropriate steps to minimise transmission of the coronavirus.

Starting from next Monday, as we will still be under stayat-home restrictions, we ask that families ring in and let us know if their children are attending school the next day.

As I have mentioned previously, some of our front office staff and many teachers are working from home and it is difficult to gauge how many groups we need to supervise.

We are aware that some families will be sending their students every day, however there are some students who turn up because their parents are shift-workers and are on duty. A quick call will ensure we have sufficient staff to supervise on site.
