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A monitor of progress

Week 3 is NAPLAN week 2022. This diagnostic tool is part of our school's assessment schedule. NAPLAN data is used to help monitor student progress over time against a national measure and to identify areas of strength and improvement.

Is your child worried about NAPLAN? Here are some ideas to help them beat NAPLAN nerves.

- Children in Years 3 and 5 will sit a number of tests in literacy and numeracy. This needs to be seen as just another test in their learning journey. This is ONE test held on ONE day, every two years.
- As parents, our role is to ensure that in encountering a NAPLAN test that this becomes a normalised situation in their life.
- The language we use with our children is very important. It's important your child knows that you will be proud of them no matter the test results, as long as they have tried their best. The test is a celebration of what your child knows and how they demonstrate their thinking.

Class teachers have been preparing students for next week, explaining that the environment will be different, tests will be timed, there is no collaboration and little clarification is allowed. Staff have taught students strategies on what they can do to help themselves during the assessment.

Please ensure students have a good night's sleep before the tests and have breakfast each morning before the tests
