The children of 4F are having a busy learning time in class. Every day is a new and interesting learning experience.



Suspenseful, exciting, and descriptive writing in narrative writing is the focus this term. We have had some very creative and mysterious stories written, individually and in group activities. Our imaginations went wild when we wrote our stories of the creepy house in the forest. After listening to them our hearts were pumping, and we couldn't wait to see what happened next.



Did you know that heat is energy caused by molecules bumping into each other? We are conducting experiments in science to prove this fact. When we exert energy by running and exercising, our bodies heat up and our blood pumps faster.
