NAIDOC Week

National NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia in the first week of July each year (Sunday to Sunday, this year it falls from 3 July - 10 July) to celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth. This year's theme is Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up! which is encouraging systematic change for First Nations people and communities. Getting Up, Standing Up and Showing Up can take many forms, such as supporting and securing



institutional, structural, collaborative and cooperative reforms, as well as celebrating the many people who have driven and led change over generations.

This week at Nemingha PS, we have participated in activities in class, raising awareness of NAIDOC Week and its meaning. Yesterday Year 6 led students in traditional Yulunga indigenous games, allowing students to experience leadership and gain knowledge of culture.

We are now calling for any children who would like to be a part of this year's ASCA program please collect a note from Mrs Harris. This includes any students who are new to the program or want to find out information about it.


