MATHS A TO Z

The department's A to Z glossary provides straightforward explanations and illustrated examples of maths terms used in the classroom. Use this resource to assist your child with their homework, or in general discussions about mathematics. Some interesting things to talk about could include:

The Fibonacci sequence

Numbers following a sequence in which each subsequent number is the sum of the previous two numbers.

Example: This sequence starts with 1: The numbers 1, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8,... 1+1=2, 1+2=3, 2+3=5, 3+5=8, 5+8=13

Roman numerals

An ancient number system represented by characters such as I (1), V(5), X(10), L(50), C(100), D(500) and M(1 000).

Examples: 7 in Roman numerals is VII 65 in Roman numerals is LXV

Discussing these things at home can add to what we do here at school and support your child to develop their curiosity about all things mathematical.
