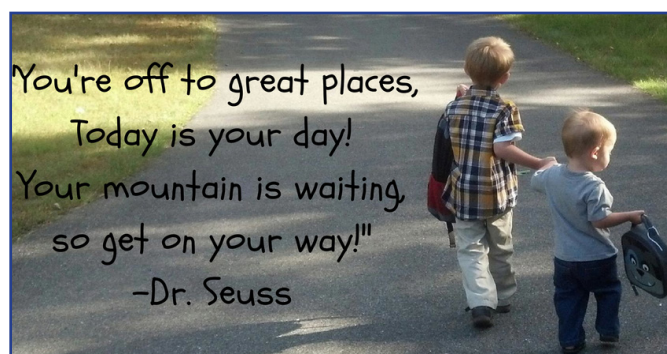

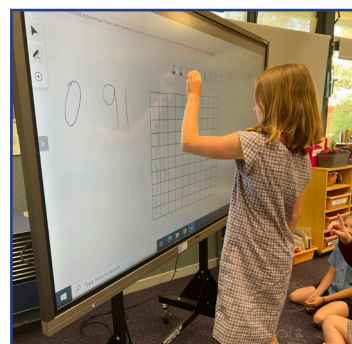
This term, I have enjoyed doing reading groups because we get to do choiceboard. I have also enjoyed practising for our MADD night.

We ask that you do not park in our disabled carparks, when dropping off, picking up or when here for assemblies.

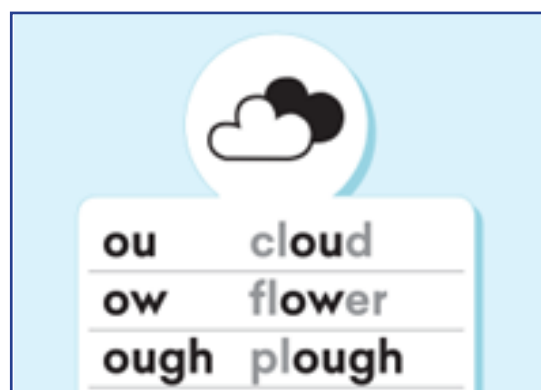
Sound of the Week
