Literacy and Numeracy Lynne Weis

New Resources to support Mathematics lessons are now available for teachers.

A set of numeracy picture book titles with over 150 linked lessons has been purchased to provide teachers with another tool to develop students' mathematical language and thinking skills. Using stories also helps children connect mathematics to the real world, developing all important numeracy skills.

These books have been organised into concepts such as place value; addition; subtraction; multiplication; division; fractions; measurement and geometry; statistics and probability, but most of them include more than one

concept, providing an opportunity to discuss the relationships in mathematics.

Our set of books is only a small sample of those available. Many of the stories you read to children at home also provide opportunities to discuss maths, and you can support what they are doing in class by helping your children make these connections.
