## SOUND OF THE WEEK

During Week 9 all of our Year 1 to Year 6 classes will be learning about the 'schwa'. The schwa is an unaccented or unstressed syllable. It is the most common sound in English. Any written vowel can have the schwa sound, or to put it another way, the schwa sound can be spelled with any vowel. The schwa sound is shorter than a short vowel sound. It takes very little effort for our mouth to say "uh" and because of this we sometimes even skip over it. For example, the second 'o' in the word chocolate is sometimes barely pronounced or even completed ignored and pronounced as 'choc'late.'
