Congratulations NPS!

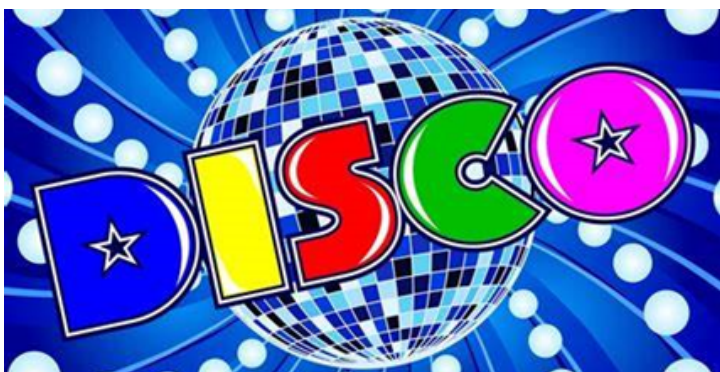
