It's amazing how much KM have learnt in such a short amount of time in their primary education. Brave – Trying to match the correct letter (grapheme) to the sound (phoneme) they hear.

Challenged - Exploring the capacity of a porridge bowl and the area of Daddy Bear, Mama Bear and Baby Bear's bed from the story about Goldilocks.

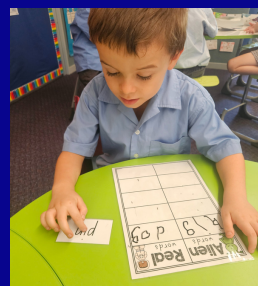
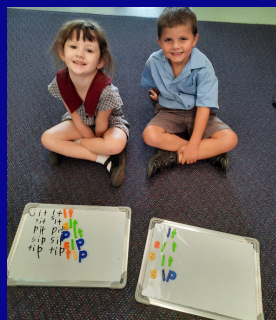
Collaborative – Learning how to work with a partner to play maths games.

Parent Workshop

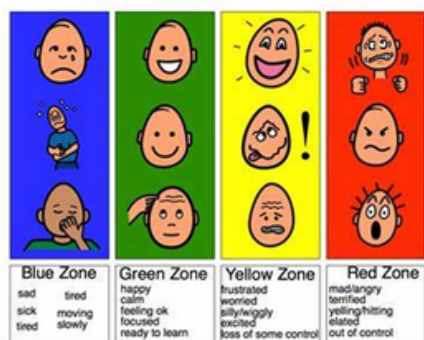

The four topics discussed were;

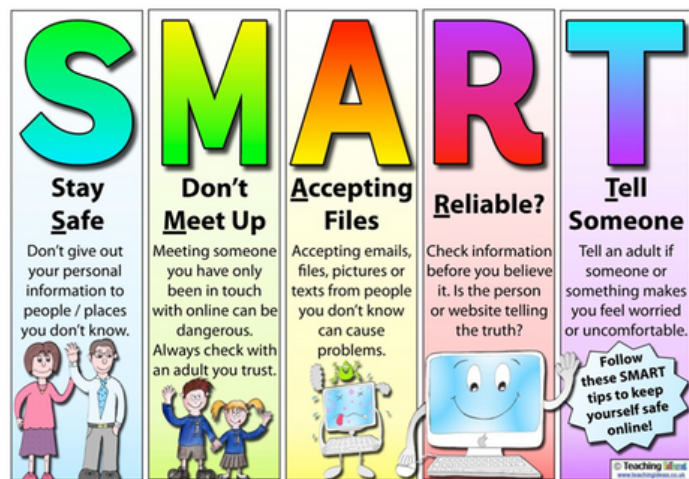
- Reporting for the new curriculum – Mrs Lynne Weis and Mrs Skye Davis
